Culture

Alternanthera 'Purple Knight' has some of the darkest foliage available in any plant species. The foliage actually gets darker and more beautiful the hotter it gets! Alternanthera plants reach their deepest, richest tones in full sun, but will turn an interesting burgundy-bronze in partial shade. Alternanthera "Purple Knight" tolerates heat well and withstands short periods of drought but performs best with weekly watering. If you have it planted in a container, water more frequently during hot, dry weather. To maintain a compact, neat look, pinch off growing tips regularly or use pruning shears to maintain a more formal appearance. Lightly fertilize plants in the ground every month or two. Fertilize container plantings every few weeks throughout the growing season. Alternanthera is a frost-tender perennial; it grows as an annual in all zones but U.S. Department of Agriculture hardiness zones 10 and 11. It may overwinter in cooler zones if planted in a protected, warm space or brought indoors

Noteworthy Characteristics

This highly reliable performer requires little in the way of care, and rewards you with an eye-catching display of royal purple foliage that deepens in color under full sun. Striking leaves on long stems arch outward, lending a graceful accent to mixed containers, beds and borders. It is a tropical plant with dark purple foliage and a sprawling, vigorous growth habit. Choose a suitable site or container for this plant and provide proper care throughout the growing season to keep it looking its best. Excellent for creating contrast, this tropical perennial forms a low, branching, groundcover of deep, purple-ruby foliage. Loves heat & rich, moist soil, but suffers if not in well-drained soil. Its colorful, oppositely arranged leaves are generally linear to oval, often with toothed margins, and vary in size. 'Purple Knight' will flower under short days; the flowers are small and are formed in terminal and axillary spikes.

Problems
